

# Nottinghamshire and Nottingham Replacement Waste Local Plan - Part 1: Waste Core Strategy

## ADOPTION STATEMENT

In accordance with Regulations 26 and 35 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012, notice is hereby given that Nottinghamshire County Council and Nottingham City Council formally adopted the Nottinghamshire and Nottingham Waste Core Strategy on 10<sup>th</sup> December 2013.

The Waste Core Strategy is the first part of a new Waste Local Plan for Nottinghamshire and Nottingham and will replace in part the Nottinghamshire and Nottingham Waste Local Plan (as saved by the Secretary of State's Direction of 21 September 2007). A full list of those policies which are being replaced is specified within the Waste Core Strategy.

The Waste Core Strategy sets out the vision, spatial strategy and strategic policies for the County of Nottinghamshire and Nottingham City until 2031. Site allocations, where appropriate, and development management policies will be contained in a subsequent document which is being prepared and consulted upon separately. These will form the second part of the replacement Waste Local Plan.

Mrs Susan Holland, MA DipTP MRTPI DipPollCon, an independent Inspector appointed by the Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government considered the Waste Core Strategy at public Examination Hearings held between 8<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> May 2013. The Councils requested that the Inspector recommend modifications in order to make the Waste Core Strategy sound where necessary. The Inspector's final report was published on 7<sup>th</sup> October 2013. The Councils accepted the Inspector's recommendations and have adopted the Waste Core Strategy accordingly.

Any person aggrieved by the Waste Core Strategy may make an application to the High Court under Section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act (2004). Any challenge must be made on the grounds that either the document has not been prepared within the powers conferred by Part 2 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 or that a procedural requirement of the Act or associated Regulations has not been complied with. Any such application should be made promptly and in any event no later than 6 weeks after the date of Adoption (that is by 21<sup>st</sup> January 2014).

The adopted Waste Core Strategy, Inspector's Report, this Adoption Statement, the Sustainability Appraisal Report and its associated Adoption Statement (prepared in accordance with Paragraph (16)(3) and (4) of the Environmental Assessment of Plans and Programmes Regulations 2004 (The SEA Regulations)) are available for public inspection free of charge at County Hall, West Bridgford, Nottingham, NG2
