Paul will speak about the key role that education can play in promoting social mobility, about what has been achieved to date and about the challenges and opportunities moving forward. In an interactive session, John will use his experience as National Pupil Premium Champion since 2013 to describe the latest policy on pupil premium. He will set out a methodology for schools to follow to spend the grant most effectively. John will refer to the best practice elsewhere and will enable schools to plan the way forward for their own pupil premium spending.

Delegates will also have the opportunity to attend two workshops. These will be led by school leaders from across the country and will explore case studies of how schools have established a track record of closing gaps for learners from disadvantaged backgrounds.

Switch-on

As part of the Every Child a Reader programme Nottinghamshire EIS offer training and support on a range of whole-school initiatives and literacy intervention strategies.

Switch-on Reading

The aim of the Switch-on Reading intervention is that children become more confident, active and independent readers able to use a range of effective reading strategies. Through professional development, practitioners extend their skills, knowledge and understanding of reading development.

Switch-on Reading:

is a personalised reading intervention based on the principles of Reading Recovery for children who are underachieving across the primary and secondary age range

- is run by a trained adult over a 10 week period for 20 minutes each day
- accelerates learning so that pupils make, at least, twice age related progress
- uses age appropriate reading materials.

Switch-on Writing

This writing intervention can be used either alongside Switch-on Reading to develop writing strategies to reciprocate the effective strategies developed in reading or as a standalone writing intervention.

Switch-on Writing has been shown to be effective across the primary and secondary age ranges. Children become more confident, active and independent writers, using a range of effective strategies. Practitioners build on their skills, knowledge and understanding of writing.

Switch-on Writing:

- is a personalised or small group intervention based on the principles of Reading Recovery for children who are underachieving across the primary and secondary age range
- is run by a trained adult over a 10 week period for 20 minutes each day.

Newly Qualified Teachers

Nottinghamshire LA has substantial expertise in the specialised area of induction and providing high quality support for Newly Qualified Teachers and their mentors. We currently support schools and academies in Nottinghamshire and further afield. Nottinghamshire LA is registered with the National College for Teaching and Leadership as an 'Appropriate Body' for NQT Induction.

NQTs need to be registered with an 'Appropriate Body' before they begin Induction.

The Appropriate Body's role includes offering support and guidance to NQTs and their Induction Tutors where issues, queries and concerns are raised, registering on the NQT NCTL database, monitoring consistency of provision and the final assessment of NQTs.

Registering NQTs with an 'Appropriate Body' marks the start of their induction period and is a statutory requirement for the following settings:

- Maintained schools (primary, special and secondary).
- A maintained or non-maintained nursery school.
- A nursery which forms part of a maintained school.
- A local authority children's centre.
- A Pupil Referral Unit (PRU).

Academies, Independent Schools, Free Schools, Studio Schools and other settings choosing to register their new teachers with an 'Appropriate Body' to take part in the NQT Induction process ensure their new teachers will be confident in the knowledge that they are working in a supportive environment to achieve a nationally recognised status.

This service gives access to:

- Advice and support on all aspects of induction.
- The NQT 'Essential Guide to Induction' events at the beginning of each term for all new NQTs. This will inform newly qualified teachers about their entitlements, their school's statutory responsibilities and the role of the 'Appropriate Body'.
- Monitoring and Quality Assurance of termly and final assessments.
- NQT Adviser support and advice by email and telephone to ensure NQTs are being supported and monitored sufficiently, or to discuss any concerns an NQT may have about his/her induction period.
- NQT Adviser Quality Assurance visits including observation of lessons and action planning support.
- NQT Adviser support and advice by email and telephone where an NQT is failing to make satisfactory progress against the Teachers' Standards.
- Induction Tutor Training including a handbook, information, guidance, the opportunity to develop skills and a wealth of resources and proformas to enable mentors to support NQTs effectively.
- Quality Assured specialised courses and conference providing further training and development opportunities for NQTs.
- Quality Assured specialised courses and conferences providing further training and development opportunities for NQTs in Secondary settings including subject specific programmes.
- Support for NQTs in building links across their professional learning communities.
