

**Features:**

Cossall is a picturesque, relatively unspoiled village on the Nottingham canal, four miles south-east of Eastwood.

- Architecturally interesting. See St. Catherine's church and church cottage as featured in DH Lawrence's *The Rainbow* and home of Lawrence's fiancée.
- Canal towpath with many wild flower species and a haven for butterflies, dragonflies and damselflies.

**Opening Times:**

- This route-based canal walk has open access

**Location:**

- Main car park is on Dead Lane.

**Paths and gates:**

- Paths along the canal are compacted stone (**B**) and are mostly level except for one section to the north which is steeper.
- The walk along the canal is accessible by wheelchairs and scooters but stiles and steps restrict access to the village.
- There is a car park in the village, which is accessible, but beware of sharp bends in the road. Some pavements stop abruptly.
- Gates are marked with a (**G**)
- Cossall is linked to another Break Free 2 route at Trowell, however the link is not suitable for wheelchairs.
