The Public Sector Equality Duty which is set out in the Equality Act 2010 requires public authorities to have due regard to the need to: Eliminate unlawful discrimination, harassment and victimisation; Advance equality of opportunity between people who share a protected characteristic and those who do not; Foster good relations between people who share a protected characteristic and those who do not.

The purpose of carrying out an Equality Impact Assessment is to assess the impact of a change to services or policy on people with protected characteristics and to demonstrate that the Council has considered the aims of the Equality Duty.

Part A: Impact, consultation and proposed mitigation

1 What are the potential impacts of proposal? *Has any initial consultation informed the identification of impacts?*

This proposal continues the programme of establishing Community Partnership Libraries (CPLs).

The proposal ensures that the comprehensive public library service is maintained and provides an extensive network of physical access points, based on maintaining access to current library facilities or alternative forms of library provision.

A CPL is a formal agreement between the partner and the County Council, which ensures that access to library services is maintained to all members of the community and the service is delivered on the same basis as the rest of the network of libraries, meeting the statutory duty to provide a library service.

The establishment of a CPL will mean new operational arrangements, including the use of volunteers in some circumstances. This could impact on protected characteristics if the volunteers are not trained in equality and diversity.
