## A Monthly Analysis of Employment, Unemployment and Jobs

EB 7/16

### June 2016

Unemployment according to the Government's preferred measure was 1.65 million in the three months to May 2016, down 54,000 from the previous three months and down 201,000 from the same period a year ago. The unemployment rate was 4.9%, down 0.2% from the previous three months and down 0.7% from a year earlier.

The unemployment rate for 18-24 year olds was 11.6% in the three months to May 2016, down 0.6% on the quarter and down 2.4% on the year. There were 475,000 unemployed young people aged from 18 to 24 in the quarter to May 2016. This is down by 25,000 on the quarter and down by 100,000 over the year. Comparisons of youth unemployment over time are complicated by the fact that unemployment rates are calculated as the number of unemployed people divided by the economically active population which excludes those

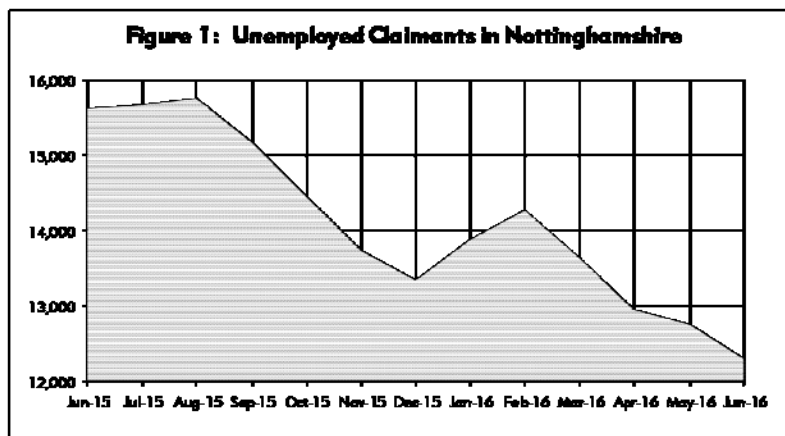
not seeking or available for work. Unemployment rates are not the proportion of the total population who are unemployed. They are the proportion of the economically active population (those in work plus those seeking and available to work) who are unemployed. The long-term

increase in the proportion of young people going into full-time education reduces the size of the economically active population and therefore increases the unemployment rate.

The seasonally adjusted claimant figure for the United Kingdom decreased by 3,700 last month to 590,200 and was down 157,900 over the year.

The number of people in employment aged 16 and over increased by 176,000 over the quarter to reach 31.70 million. The employment rate for those aged 16 to 64 is now 74.4%, the highest since comparable records began in 1971.

The number of people in full-time employment increased by 118,000 on the quarter to



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reach 23.19 million. The number of people in part-time employment was 8.51 million in the three months to May 2016, up 59,000 on the previous quarter and up 223,000 on the year.

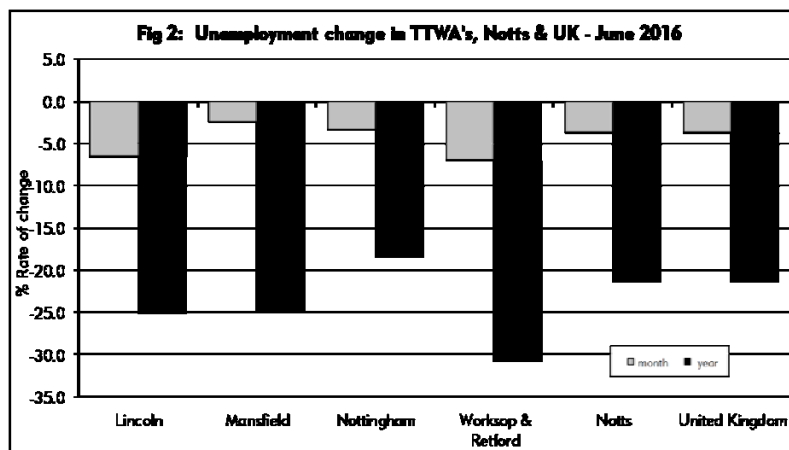
In the three months to May 2016, there were 8.87 million economically inactive people aged from 16 to 64, down 46,000 from the previous quarter and down 181,000 from a year earlier.

Average total pay (including bonuses) was £502 per week in May 2016. Over the year total pay for employees in Great Britain increased by 2.3%. Average regular pay (excluding bonuses) was £471 per week in May 2016. Over the year regular pay for employees in Great Britain rose by 2.2%. Between May 2015 and May 2016 there was a 0.3% increase in the Consumer Prices Index.

There were 747,000 job vacancies in the three months to June 2016, down 10,000 from the previous three months but 15,000 more than a year earlier.

There were 2.2 unemployed people per vacancy in the period from March to May 2016, unchanged on the quarter but down by 0.3 on the year.

In the three months to May 2016, 104,000 people became redundant in the three months prior to their Labour



Force Survey interview. This is down 8,000 from the previous three months and down 15,000 on the year. The redundancy rate was 3.9 per 1,000 employees, down 0.3% from the previous three months and down 0.6% from a year earlier.

The unadjusted JSA claimant figure for the United Kingdom has decreased by 22,038 over the month to 576,621. The proportion unemployed calculated on the residence base now stands at 1.4% of the population aged 16-64.

The number of claimants in Nottinghamshire decreased by 459 between May and June 2016. The total of 12,290 is 3,341 less than it was a year ago (see figure 1).

The proportion unemployed in Nottinghamshire is now 1.7%. This is higher than the East Midlands (1.2%) and

the United Kingdom (1.4%).

Between May and June 2016, unemployment decreased in all of the four Travel To Work Areas in the County (figure 2). Worksop & Retford experienced the largest decrease with a rate of change of -6.9%, followed by Lincoln with -6.5%, Nottingham with -3.4% and Mansfield with -2.5%.

Compared with May 2015, all of the four TTWA's in the County have reduced numbers of claimants. The largest change has been in Worksop & Retford with a rate of change of -30.8% followed by Lincoln with -25.1%, Mansfield with -24.9% and Nottingham with -18.4%.

Unemployment decreased in all of the seven Local Authority Districts in the County over the month. The largest decreases were in Rushcliffe with -10.1% and Bassetlaw with -5.3%. Unemployment in the City of

The rates shown in tables 1-4 are supplied by ONS. They are calculated by expressing the claimant count figures as a proportion of the resident population aged 16-64 derived from the latest mid-year population figures.

Nottingham decreased by 239 over the month resulting in a rate of change of -3.6%.

The rates of change have varied throughout the County over the year, from -30.5% in Newark & Sherwood to -16.2% in Gedling. Nottingham City changed by -17.5% over the year.

Unemployment decreased in seven of the eight Parliamentary Constituencies in the County during June. Rushcliffe and Newark recorded the largest decreases,

experiencing rates of change of -10.3% and -5.4%. Over the month Nottingham East has changed by -4.1%, Nottingham North by -3.7% and Nottingham South by -2.7%.

All of the eight Parliamentary Constituencies in the County have decreased numbers of claimants compared with the same period last year resulting in rates of change ranging from -16.5% in Rushcliffe to -34.5% in Mansfield. The three Nottingham Constituencies

have rates of change of -18.6% in Nottingham East, -19.4% in Nottingham North and -12.7% in Nottingham South.

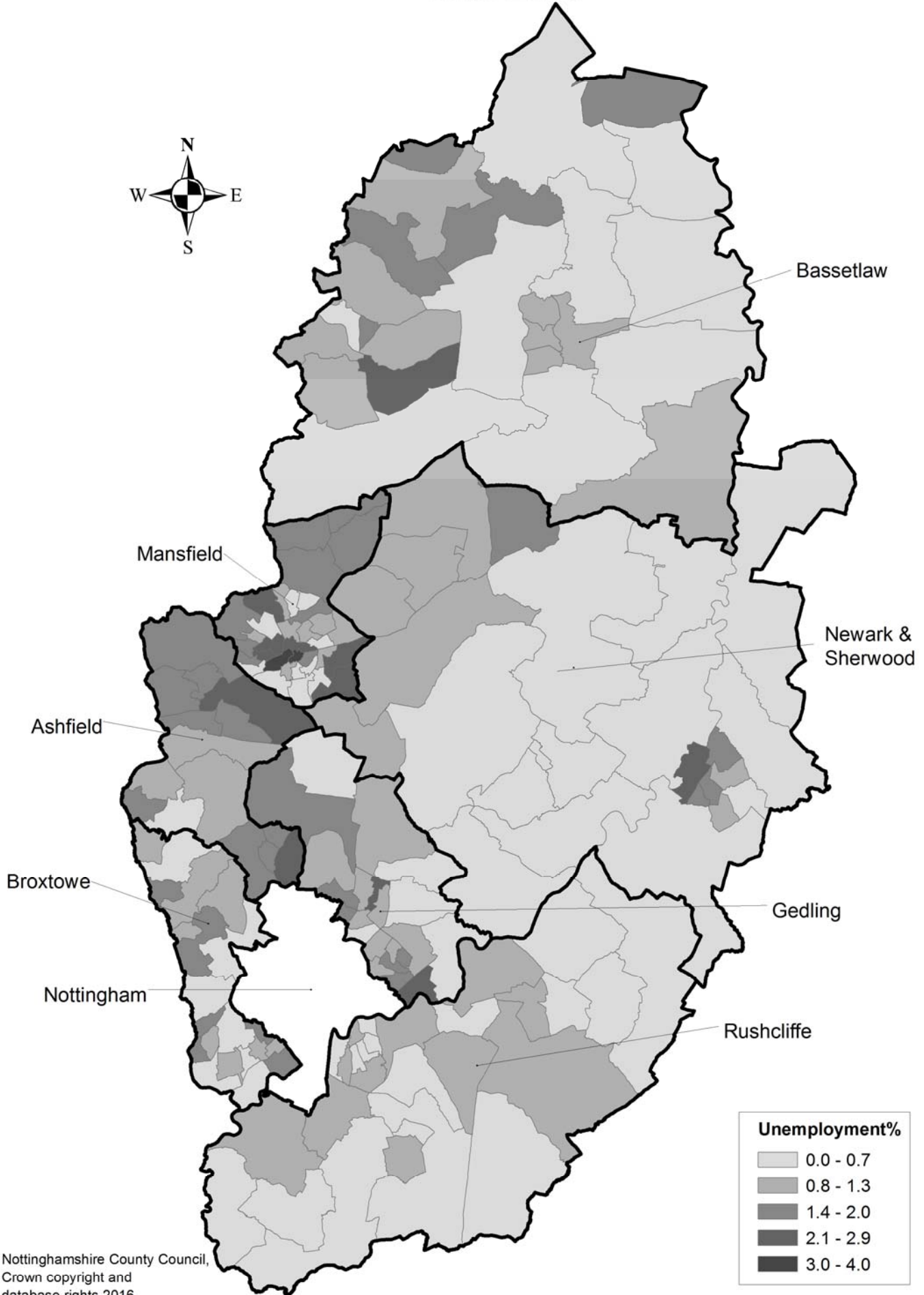

**New Disclosure Control Procedures with JSA Claimant Count Data**

The procedure follows an interim review of the confidentiality of JSA claimant count data, and is required for compliance with the National Statistics Code of Practice for Data Access and Confidentiality.

The procedure is the primary suppression of any cell count of 1 or 2, which is instead denoted by the symbol '#'. A true value of zero continues to be shown as 0.
