Family Support

At Caudwell Children we recognise that disabled children and those with complex health needs must have access to the health care, adaptations and equipment they require.

We know that many families have to struggle through a maze of services to track down essential information, and then jump through hoops to receive support. We also understand that whether or not a family receives support could be based on where they live.

Our Family Services offer vital support to families caring for a disabled child or young person. The service can provide telephone, email and face to face support to help families to make informed choices and gain access to equipment, treatment, therapies and local services they need.



Equipment

Gain one to one information about equipment that increases children's independence and quality of life including wheelchairs, therapy tricycles and sensory equipment.

Treatment and Therapy

Caudwell Children understand the difficulties in finding information about treatment and therapies that could make a lasting difference to a child's health and wellbeing. We help families understand more about the range of treatments and therapies available, as well as providing access to some specialist therapies and treatment.

Financial and Funding Information

Since its launch in 2000, Caudwell Children has made a real and lasting change to the lives of children and their families, providing financial and practical support for equipment, treatment and therapies. The Family Support programme will also provide families with access to 3,500 trusts that have £362 million available each year for individuals in need.

Caudwell Children's Family Support programme offers families with a disabled or seriously ill child (0-18) the support they need. The free service works around the needs of families, using skilled volunteers to help with practical necessities like applying for grants, finding local support groups and information about medical conditions.

The service will support families to gain access to

- **Therapy**
- **Treatment**
- **Support Groups**
- **Equipment**
- **Help identifying grants and sources of funding**
- **Information relating to medical conditions**
- **Signposting to specialist sources of advice**
