Caring for Carers - together

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Carers in Nottinghamshire

2001 census = 83,181

2011 census = 90,698 carers

57,426 caring between 1-19 hours per week (63%)

11,592 caring between 20-49 hours per week (13%)


21,680 caring over 50 hours per week (24%)





What do we know about identified carers?

Profile of carers supported by Nottinghamshire County Council



67% of carers are female

53% of carers are of working age (18 - 64)

5% of carers are 85 and over

53% of these are female

94% are white 3% carers are from black & minority ethnic groups

Spending on support for carers

Nottinghamshire County Council spends £3.1 million on carers.

Local CCGs spend £800k on carers.






Carer Display at local Practice with details of Carer Champion

Historically...

Carers were given face to face appointment at home, with information and advice and often a carer's assessment.





Now...Carer's Assessment

- Online convenient for the carer, who can describe the impact of caring in their own words, whenever they choose
- By phone less intrusive and less time consuming
- Social Care clinics less intrusive and near to carer's home
- Face to face carer choice / any communication issues







Carers Support Service

- 6 Community Care Officers based at the Customer Services Centre
 - Carer's assessments & reviews over telephone
 - Assess eligibility
 - Advice & information to carers and signpost to voluntary and statutory in the community e.g. Carers Hub
 - NHS Carers' breaks funded by local Clinical Commissioning Groups
 - Carers' Personal Budget
 - Carers' emergency card
 - Bespoke information pack of resources available locally
 - Online carers' assessments
 - Clinics in the community

- Focus of project to identify 'seldom heard' carers, & issues & barriers
- Nottingham Trent University undertaking research

- New/different or amended services to meet needs of 'seldom heard' carer groups
- Market shaping & development
