

Overall services were of good quality and the performance of the Youth Justice Service very creditable.</p> <p><b>Key Strengths</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Good quality pre-sentence reports inform sentencing;</li> <li>Initial assessments of children and young people provided a firm foundation for work to reduce future offending;</li> <li>Risk of harm and vulnerability assessments were of good quality;</li> <li>Planning to reduce the risk of reoffending, protect the public, children and young people was very good;</li> <li>Staff worked well with children and young people to ensure their compliance with the requirements of their sentence.</li> </ul> <p><b>Areas Requiring Improvement</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>There should be more focus on the specific needs of girls in initial assessments and planning processes.</li> </ul>	<p>There will be 10 JTAs undertaken per year, with a new 'deep dive' theme every 6 months.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>First 2 themes have been CSE /missing children (Feb - Aug 16), and children living with domestic abuse (Sep 16 - Feb 17).</li> <li>The 'deep dive' theme for March to September 2017 will be neglect.</li> <li>A NCC Self-Assessment is being completed.</li> </ul> <p><b>Feedback from CSE/Missing 'Deep Dive' Inspections</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Prevention and raising awareness in local communities was seen to be a real strength;</li> <li>There needs to be a better understanding of why children go missing at an individual and a strategic level if agencies are to do more to protect them;</li> <li>Leaders' and managers' oversight and supervision of frontline practice are critical;</li> <li>Strategic goals must be clearly identified, understood and agreed across agencies, which also must commit resources to tackle CSE.</li> </ul>																													
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
