The C Card Scheme....what is it?

The C Card Scheme is a free sexual health advice and condom service for young people aged 13-25.

It allows young people to get access to condoms, lubricants and ask any questions they have about sex, sexually transmitted infections (STI's) and relationships with at trained C Card Worker.

Aim;


To reduce the rates of Teenage Pregnancy and Sexually Transmitted Infections through the provision of free condoms to young people in Nottinghamshire through the C Card Scheme.

Key priorities

- Prevention of teenage conception and poor sexual health through contraception and sexual health service provision.
- CYP have access to information and education about sexual health and relationships


- Workers to have the skills, confidence and knowledge to support CYP and families with teenage pregnancy issues
- Improved outcomes for teenage parents and their children.

1998-2014 Progress



The 2014 under 18 conception rate for Nottinghamshire was **21.1** per 1,000 females aged 15-17 a decrease of 12.2% from the 2013 rate of 24.2%, and a **decrease of 54.5% since the 1998** baseline year. The number of under 18 conceptions in 2014 was 294, 320 fewer than in the 1998 baseline year where the number was 614.


District Teenage Conception Rates 1998-2014



Hot Spots Wards 2012-14

- 37 hot spot wards
- 28 are 'persistent' hot spot wards
- 9 are 'emerging' hot spots
- 10 wards have been de-classified as hotspots since the last period.

- 211 Issue points
- 488 trained staff
- 7,578 young people aged 13-25 registered on the C Card scheme
- Average of 2,000 active C Card Users per year
- 59% of C Card users are registered within a hot spot ward district

How it Works...

Wherever there is a C Card Sign young people can sign up for free condoms and lubes by undertaking a **registration process** that ensures it is appropriate to offer them this service.

The advice is free and confidential and aimed at helping young people make the right choice about there sexual health

Young people have to attend a **Registration Point** to receive a C Card.

It is available from a range of places in Nottinghamshire including;


- Health Centres/GP Surgeries/SEXions
- Pharmacies
- Young People Centres
- Schools and Colleges

After the **Registration process** a young person receives a plastic c card like this, and can start accessing condoms and lubes from a range of <u>Registration and Pick Up Points</u>.



How to be involved

To offer the C Card you have to become a trained C Card Worker.

This can be done in three simple steps;

- 1. Attend a one day training course were you will learn all about the scheme and how to register young people
- Sign a 'Working Agreement' between you and the C card Scheme agreeing the guidance of service
- 3. Start offering the C Card to the young people you work with.
