





Hickling Footpaths - Summary of Events

- L. The matter first arose in 1978 as a result of an application on behalf of Mr. and Mrs. Johnson of Long Lane, Hickling and by Miss G.M. Price for the formal diversion of the Footpath numbered 1 and 2 on the plan attached hereto. Messrs. R.A. Young & Pearce, acting on behalf of Mr. and Mrs. Johnson and Miss Price, were informed that the footpaths in question were not shown on the definitive map for the village. The recognised paths are shown marked blue on the plan.
- 2. At around the same time the Parish Council wrote to the Planning and Transportation Department claiming the footpaths numbers 1, 2, 3 and 4 on the plan on behalf of the village. Numerous fights of way information sheets were supplied but unfortunately no plans were attached to those sheets and the exact route of the paths being claimed was not ascertained until later.
- 3. In June 1978 Footpaths numbered 1, 2, 3 and 4 were examined by one of the County Council's Footpaths Inspectors. Both paths were found to cross grass fields and were not easily definable on the ground. Path 4 was found to terminate at a fence giving access onto Long Lane but this was badly overgrown with shrubs and obstructed with barbed wire which had been in position for some considerable time. It was at this point that the matter was referred to the Clerk's Department.
- 4. In November 1978 a letter was sent to Messrs. R.A. Young & Pearce pointing out that the County Council had received 31 public rights of way information sheets from the Parish Council indicating that the paths in question had been used by the public as of right, 26 of those sheets having been completed by persons who had known and walked the paths for periods ranging from 20 80 years. Copies of the rights of way information sheets were subsequently sent to Messrs. R.A. Young & Pearce.
- 5. In October of 1979 the County Council received from Messrs. R.A. Young & Pearce a Statutory Declaration pursuant to Section 34 (6) pf the Highways Act 1959 signed by Mr. and Mrs. Johnson and declaring that as far as they were concerned, the only public footpaths which they acknowledged to exist on their land were those which were already shown on the definitive map.
- 6. In November 1979 a letter was received from the Parish Council saying that the Parish were to meet Mr. and Mrs. Johnson with a view to seeking a solution acceptable to both sides.
- 7. On 14th March 1980 a meeting was held with Mr. and Mrs. Johnson and their solicitor. Mr. and Mrs. Johnson cast doubts on the exact route of the paths being claimed by the Parish Council. They pointed out that Path I was not in fact a straight line since it had a "dog leg" in it to enable the path to pass round the corner of their property. With regard to Path Number 4 it was stated by Mr. and Mrs. Johnson that the Parish Council were in fact claiming a diagonal path running from the bottom of the orchard up to Long Lane (Path 5 on the attached plan). With regard to Paths 3 and 4/5 it was accepted by the County Council that at that time there was no evidence to suggest a public

route basically along the line of Footpath Number 4, the County Council at that time being under the impression that the Inclosure Award for the Parish of Hickling may have awarded a public footpath along the line of Paths Numbers 3 and 4. Mr. and Mrs. Johnsons' view was that they were not willing to acknowledge that public rights existed along Path Number 4 and their solicitor stated that he would look into the question of the wording of the Inclosure Award. Mesars. R.A. Young & Pearce were subsequently able to prove to the satisfaction of the County Council that Paths numbers 3 and 4 were not referred to in the Inclosure Award and that in fact the route of the awarded paths was as shown in the definitive map. It was indicated to the County Council that Messrs. R.A. Young & Pearce had sought the advice of Counsel and that it was Counsel's view that, on the strength of the evidence so far supplied, the Parish Council were not able to demonstrate that public rights emisted over any of the paths claimed.
