Further to your recent Freedom of Information request, Nottinghamshire County Council became the responsible commissioner for substance misuse services in April 2013 and no information regarding these services is held prior to then. The Public Health Grant allocation, and spend on substance misuse (drug and alcohol) services is as follows:

2013/14 – PH Grant allocation: £35,151,474 / Substance Misuse spend: £11,096,168
2014/15 – PH Grant allocation: £36,119,000 / Substance Misuse spend: £10,970,263
2015/16 - PH Grant allocation: £33,523,497 / Substance Misuse spend: £10,843,196
2016/17 - PH Grant allocation: £43,260,000 / Substance Misuse spend: £9,399,418
