## Dear

I am writing to you in reply to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request to Nottinghamshire County Council. I have the following information.

- 1) The number of potholes identified in the local authority.
- 2) The number of potholes identified by the local authority that were not filled during the given year. Please see the following table and note as answer to this enquiry:

| Year | No. of jobs raised | No. completed | Raised-completed |
|------|--------------------|---------------|------------------|
| 2015 | 11142              | 10858         | 284              |
| 2016 | 13291              | 13698         | -407             |
| 2017 | 16824              | 16844         | -20              |

Supporting notes to this data extract:

Prior to 2017 there was inconsistency in the way pothole repairs were issued and recorded in the Highway Asset Management System (HAMS). The reported data above is the number of jobs, therefore, a job may consist of multiple repairs. Since May 2016, the working and recording methods were changed to allow individual repairs to be quantified since that date. Therefore, given your request and the time period involved we have provided job data.

The balance between raised and completed show a large negative in 2016 as there were a number of incomplete jobs coming into 2015 from 2014 and 2016 from 2015 which distort the data. These incomplete jobs consist of the following:

- jobs where part of the work is complete but elements are outstanding.
- housekeeping issues where the job just hasn't been closed down.
- and jobs that haven't been done.

This is further complicated by the categorisation of the repairs and the time allowed for them to be carried out (24hours / 28days / 90days). Those jobs that have a 28 & 90 days completion period, distort the yearly comparison of data because of the yearly rollover they create which is not linear. Therefore, you will be unable to interpret any pattern from this information other than there was a potential backlog in jobs being completed on the system which since 2016 we have been working to resolve and hence in 2017 the yearly outcome is more balanced.
