

ICDS – Occupational Therapy Privacy Notice

Introduction

This privacy notice details the manner in which the Council may process personal data that we obtain about you or other individuals known to the service

Who will be using your data?

Nottinghamshire County Council will be the data controller for the data you provide to us.

We may also contract third party organisations to process your data on our behalf.

What personal data do we use?

What types of special category personal data do we need from you?

- Racial or ethnic origin
- Advocacy details
- Social care support outcomes
- Physical, sensory and mental health details
- Data concerning sex life or sexual orientation
- Religious, philosophical or other beliefs of a similar nature

We also may access data about criminal convictions, criminal offences or related security measures.

Why do we use your data?

- For service delivery
- For service planning, training and improvement
- To safeguard children and young people
- To assess the need to refer onto other services

What legal reasons allow us to use your data in this way?

Our legal basis for processing your personal data is that it is necessary to perform our public tasks as a local authority.

Our legal basis for processing your special category personal data is that it is necessary for the provision and management of health or social care services.

Our legal basis for processing data related to criminal convictions, criminal offences or related security measures is that it is necessary to perform our public tasks as a local authority.

- Local Government Act 1972, section 111 which provides that Nottinghamshire County Council is able to do anything which is calculated to facilitate, or is conducive or incidental to, the discharge of any of its functions
- Localism Act 2011, which gives Nottinghamshire County Council the general competency power to do anything which is not specifically forbidden by another statue.

Who may we share your data with or receive it from?

May personal data be transferred overseas?

The Council may for operational purposes transfer personal data overseas. In these cases, we will ensure that your personal data is protected and there are safeguards for the protection of your rights. Please refer to the Council's privacy statement for further details.

How long is your data kept for?

This information is held in accordance with the Council's retention schedule – see here.

What will happen if you do not provide or we cannot obtain the data needed?

- We could not assess and provide support to meet the individual needs of the child / young person
- We could not provide equipment or adaptations to enable care of the child or young person
- We could not work to individual outcomes to improve the independence / life choices of the child / young person

Does the service make decisions using fully automated processes?

What rights do you have over this use of your data?

- To access a copy of your data that we process
- To have us rectify or correct your data that we process, in certain circumstances
- To restrict our processing of your personal data
- To object to the use of your data
