The Public Sector Equality Duty which is set out in the Equality Act 2010 requires public authorities to have due regard to the need to: Eliminate unlawful discrimination, harassment and victimisation; Advance equality of opportunity between people who share a protected characteristic and those who do not; Foster good relations between people who share a protected characteristic and those who do not.

The purpose of carrying out an Equality Impact Assessment is to assess the impact of a change to services or policy on people with protected characteristics and to demonstrate that the Council has considered the aims of the Equality Duty.

Part A: Impact, consultation and proposed mitigation

1 What are the potential impacts of proposal? Has any initial consultation informed the identification of impacts?

This EqIA accompanies the proposal to make a number of reductions to the value of contracts for a range of externally contracted services.

Following a review of adult social care contracts with independent and voluntary sector providers, three contracts have been identified with the potential to deliver savings.

Service 1 is a 24 hour Response Service. It is currently under-going a retender. It is anticipated that efficiencies can be achieved through changes to the payment mechanism under the new contract for this service, which provides assistive technology linked support primarily aimed at older people. Therefore no reduction is anticipated to service capacity.

Services 2 and 3 provide early intervention and promoting independence support to older adults and younger adults. Both have recently been reviewed prior to an extension of contract. Discussions have taken place with two services about getting most effective use of the level of service available and the reductions proposed reflect a combination of current spare capacity and plan for more effective use of the service levels available. The proposed reductions are not expected to adversely affect the services offered.

No NCC staff will be affected by these changes. Services 2 and 3 are both externally contracted. The reduction in value of the contract will result in a reduction in staffing levels within those services. Each of the service providers will need to determine whether redundancies will be required to achieve this reduction. The services affected are aware of the proposed reductions.
