We work hard to deliver a comprehensive ASYE programme which provides support and assessment to all our NQSWs working with adults during their first year of employment.

So that you can take advantage of all that the ASYE programme offers, over the course of the year your manager will meet with you regularly and offer you additional support and reflective mentoring sessions. You will also have access to a bespoke programme of learning, development and training, as well as ample time for study days, giving you opportunities to meet with your peers to share your experiences and learn from each other.

In addition to the programme itself, you'll also be able to access a wide range of other training courses (classroom based and e-learning) that will help broaden your understanding and skills.
