NRPF

As of 20th May 2019, Nottinghamshire Social Care currently support and involved with 50 children (23 families) whose parents are identified as having No Recourse to Public Funds and therefore financial assistance is being issued as they are not recognised as receiving s95 support from the Home Office.

Ashfield – 13 children / 7 families
Bassetlaw – 1 child / 1 family
Broxtowe – 8 children / 2 families
Gedling – 13 children / 5 families
Mansfield – 9 children / 4 families
Newark & Sherwood – 2 children / 1 family
Rushcliffe – 4 children / 3 families

Total Supported: 50 children / 23 families in Nottinghamshire

Since 1st January 2018, Nottinghamshire Social Care have supported 54 children and 26 families in total in respect of No Recourse to Public Funds

UASC

As of 30th April 2019, Nottinghamshire Social Care have 24 Unaccompanied Asylum Seeking Children (UASC) aged under 18 years who are Looked After by Nottinghamshire of which 12 live within the Nottinghamshire authority region.

Former UASC

As of 22^{nd} Feb 2019, Nottinghamshire Social Care have 71 former UASC young people aged 18-24 years who are receiving or entitled to Leaving Care Support (including the extended Personal Advisor Service), of which 16 young people are classed as having No Recourse to Public Funds (NRPF) status, and so financial support and accommodation is being provided by Nottinghamshire Social Care as the young people are not being supported by s95 accommodation and finance
