Support for Children's Transition over the Summer holiday break 2020

We are all aware of the importance of good communication between providers to support smooth transitions. Through our regular conversations with you we are aware that in many cases these conversations have taken place and schools and settings have been in contact to share information and ideas about how they are approaching transitions this year. We would advise you to use the *All About Me* paperwork you have completed in previous years wherever it is possible to share information with the child's new setting. We also suggest that you provide details of the child's experience of lockdown and how this has reshaped their learning. Many of you have given much consideration as to how you will support children and their families to say a 'meaningful goodbye' to their key person, friends and the setting environment if they are not returning to the setting. We have heard some great ideas of how settings are supporting children and families to do this. Some are planning virtual graduation ceremonies . In one setting the child's key person is making a short personalised video for each child who is leaving to say good bye and to remember special things about the child's time with them . Some have shared, where appropriate, videos of staff and environments made during the lockdown. Others have chosen to send postcards or letters from the child's key person. We would love to hear more about the creative and innovative things you have been doing to support transitions.

Transition Funding for Vulnerable Children

Support for the most vulnerable children over the summer break. (Vulnerable children includes:- LAC, CPP, CIN, EHCP/SEND and those classed by the setting as "otherwise vulnerable".)

We care pleased to confirm that in order to further support transition for the most vulnerable children who will be leaving Early Years provision to go to school in Autumn, Nottinghamshire County Council is able to fund additional sessions across the summer holiday period when Early Years Entitlements are not usually

paid. For the five week Summer holiday period, this funding will be targeted for these children as part of a wider package of support.

Settings should use this funding to provide sessions to support transition to nursery or foundation units and focus the sessions to support children's social and emotional wellbeing and school,/ nursery readiness. The most vulnerable children should be encouraged to continue attendance, as well as offering these sessions to vulnerable children who have not been in attendance as a gentle return to childcare and early education in a familiar setting before they move on to school. We encourage settings to use this funding creatively, to enable as many vulnerable children to remain in or return to the setting over the summer break.

As we have done for previous holiday payments, we will ask settings to complete a return at the end of the Summer break and will fund sessions when a child was in attendance to a maximum of 15 hours per week. We will make this return available to you in the coming weeks on the provider webpage.

Because this funding is aimed at supporting transition in a stable and familiar setting, this is only available to your regular attenders. Settings who are usually closed over the summer can, if they wish, use this funding to open up for limited sessions to support these children.

Children's Centre Activities

For children who do not remain in the setting or are in need of a more targeted offer of support, the Children's Centre service are offering a menu of activity to families in the home and the community.
