Hi perso

That looks great, and I'm pleased to see things moving with the Wellow group. Let me know when you're out and might be a good time for me to pop over; I'm only round the corner at Rufford. I'll even do my best to bring cake.

I've been doing some thinking on Wellow (and by association Grimston and Jordan's Castle). Foliot received a license to 'embattle' his manor house in 1252, so was no stranger to earthwork projects, and what he appears to have carried out at Jordan's Castle is a bit unusual as far as fortified manor houses go. I wonder if the Foliots set Wellow up to be a market town; situated on what was then a main routeway, and on the periphery of the monastic lands of Rufford. I'm not sure why you'd necessarily fortify such a place, with something requiring such manpower as the dyke, but I know relations were often strained between Wellow and Rufford due to disputes over rights in Beskall wood. It doesn't feel like it makes much sense purely as a defence, and it's interesting looking at how the dyke sits in the landscape in relation to Jordan's Castle. A couple of the locals said that they felt it had at least a dual purpose of managing water around the village. If that's the case do we need to be considering the date of Wellow Dam also? That's an enormous earthwork, very similar to the monastic dams along the Rainworth south of Rufford.

Anything that helps us understand the chronology and relationships between the foundation of Wellow (and how that impacted nearby Grimston), Jordan's Castle, the construction of the dyke and dam, might offer some insight into a landscape that frankly is just a bit odd and clearly has a lot more to tell than we currently understand.

Fingers crossed for decent weather, and I look forward to hearing your thoughts.

Hello personal data

I've had a look at the hollow way on your property and I've attached the relevant records and maps. The hollow way was first identified in a village earthwork survey in 1996 (bibliographic reference is on the hollow way record, attached). Our record of the earthwork on your site is labelled as L7690 on the maps, and is indicated by a shaded purple rectangle. One of the maps is our base map, and one is the hollow way record imposed on an 1835 Map. Below, I've included the property on the 1895 OS map (left) and the LIDAR maps (you can see the hollow way as the upper shaded line that runs WSW-ENE). You can explore these maps yourself at <https://maps.nls.uk/geo/find/#zoom=5&lat=56.00000&lon=-4.00000&layers=102&b=1&z=1&point=0,0>. As you'll see, the record itself isn't very detailed, but there could be more information if you can track down the bibliographic source (we have it in our office, but it is not possible to access it right now). You'll see on the map that there is another record to the south of the farm, and it is also visible in the LIDAR map. This was also identified in the village earthwork survey, and is likely the result of relatively recent quarrying activity.

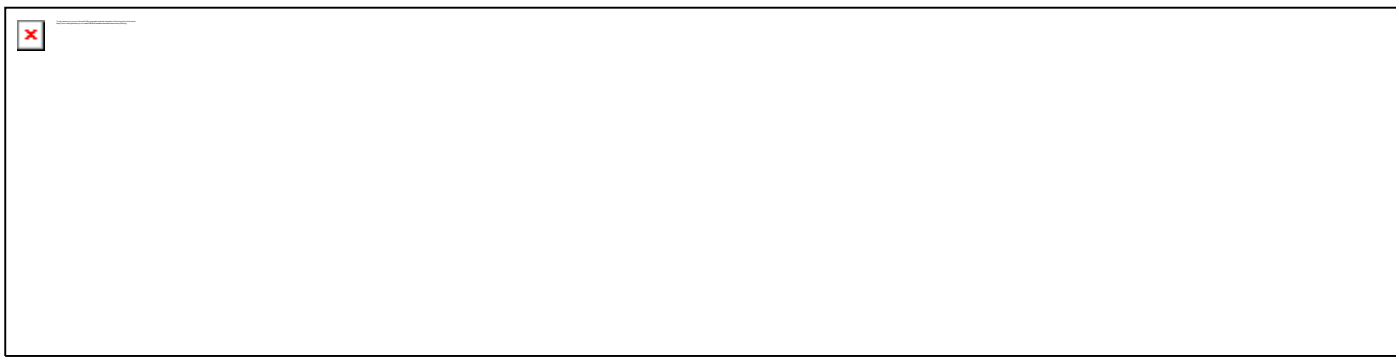
