

Nottinghamshire Minerals Local Plan

ADOPTION STATEMENT

In accordance with Regulations 26 and 35 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012, notice is hereby given that the new Nottinghamshire Minerals Local Plan was formally adopted by Nottinghamshire County Council on 25th March 2021.

This document replaces saved policies from our previous Nottinghamshire Minerals Local Plan 2005. The new Minerals Local Plan covers the period to 2036 and sets out the background, the spatial context and the strategy and policy context in which it has been prepared. It includes a vision and strategic objectives, strategic planning policies, minerals provision policies including allocations and site-criteria, and general development management policies.

The Minerals Local Plan was the subject of an independent examination conducted by Nick Palmer BA (Hons) BPI MRTPI, an Inspector appointed by the Secretary of State. The examination included virtual public hearing sessions held in October 2020. The Inspector's Report was issued on 10th March 2021and concluded that the Local Plan is sound and legally compliant, subject to the Inspector's Main Modifications, pursuant to Section 20(5) of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004.

The adopted Nottinghamshire Minerals Local Plan incorporates all the Main Modifications set out in the appendix to the Inspector's Report, as well as minor Additional Modifications agreed by the Council.

Any person aggrieved by the adoption of the Nottinghamshire Minerals Local Plan may make an application to the High Court, under Section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004, on the grounds that the document is not within the appropriate power of the local planning authority and/or a procedural requirement has not been complied with. Any such application must be made not later than **Friday 7th May 2021**.
