
## Nottinghamshire Child Poverty Interactive Map

## Instructions to use the interactive web map

1. Use the filter boxes to select and zoom to a particular Family Hub network, District, or individual Family Hub site. On a laptop screen these appear in the left column of the screen, when viewed on an ipad, tablet or mobile device, these appear below the main text at the top. Select using the drop down box and then click anywhere within the black box to activate, and the swipe button should move to the right.




The map should zoom to the selected area. Use the zoom in and zoom out buttons on the map or the wheel on the mouse to view the extent of the selected area – the area should be coloured on the map.

2. A list of wards within the selected area should appear below – use the scroll list to view all the wards in the area. These wards are colour-coded based on the legend on the map. Looking at the example below, Worksop South East ward in Bassetlaw District and in Bassetlaw Worksop Family Hub cluster has 52.4% of children aged 0-15 yrs living in relative low income families. When viewing the map on a ipad, tablet or mobile device, the list of wards appears in the box below the map.



To zoom to a particular ward on the list, hover with the cursor in the middle of the box until the scroll or grap icon appears, and then click on the box. The map should then zoom to the ward and a pop-up box should appear:




The pop-up box would also appear if you left click with the mouse on a particular ward on the map. The selected ward would have a boundary highlighted in light blue, and would appear at the top of the list of wards in the selected area. The pop-up boxes only appear when the map is viewed using a standard screen or a laptop.

- 3. To clear the filter boxes, press anywhere within the black filter box or move the swipe button to the left. Also untick the selected item in the drop down box. Then press the cancel button. The filter box should say '0 items selected' and the map should return to its normal extent. Similarly, click on the X button at the top right of the popup box to remove the pop-up box and clear the selection and reset the map, or click anywhere on the map outside of Nottinghamshire.
- 4. To show the map at its default view (whole of Nottinghamshire), press the Home button:



5. To get an overview of child poverty levels in the selected areas, view the pink box to the left of the map (see below). This gives a count of wards in the selected area and groups these according to the legend/colour scheme of the map. The chart in the box should change when a new area is selected. This box is not shown when using an ipad, tablet or mobile device to view the map.



6. The map can be extended to cover right down to the bottom edge of the screen when viewed using an ipad/tablet or mobile device. Press the button at the bottom centre of the map to extend the map:




To return the map to its normal state and hence be able to see the list of wards, press this button again.


7. To search for a particular street, postcode, town or village, go to the search box (top button in the toolbar at the top right of the map):



Type in an address eg Loughborough Road – and select from the suggestions in the list:



Select Loughborough Road Dental Practice, and the map should zoom to that location:



Use the zoom in and zoom out tools of the map to bring the legend/colouring of the map into view. Click on the map to bring up the pop-up box and view the selected ward and child poverty level in the list at the bottom left of the screen (laptop) or at the bottom of the map (ipad, tablet or mobile device).

To return the map to its default view (County of Nottinghamshire), press the Home button as above.

- 8. The second button in the toolbar brings up the legend of the map. Click the X at the top right of the box to exit the legend.
- 9. The third button in the toolbar shows the layers on the map use the tick box to turn each layer on or off.
- 10. The fourth button in the toolbar brings up a printer menu and allows the user to print part of the map shown on the screen. The usual format is PDF. Drag the box upwards to view the full contents of the print widget on the tablet, ipad or mobile screen.
