John Wilson said that all Silver and Gold members were reviewed every five years and Ashfield Homes would then be considered. Cllr Mason outlined the potential for churches signing up to the Covenant. John Wilson told of the interest from academies to signing the Covenant and described multi-academy sign-ups in other areas. John Wilson reminded members to encourage any interested companies or organisations to contact him for further information and advice.
