

## TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF BRIDLEWAY

## THE NOTTINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (BEESTON BRIDLEWAY NO.73) (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION) CONTINUATION NO.3 ORDER 2022

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Secretary of State Transport in pursuance of the powers conferred by Sections 14 and 15 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 approves of The Nottinghamshire County Council (Beeston Bridleway No.73) (Temporary Prohibition) Notice 2020 (which came into force on 29<sup>th</sup> July 2020 and was continued in force by a Continuation Order which came into force on 19<sup>th</sup> August 2020 and was further continued in force by a Continuation No.2 Order which came into force on 29<sup>th</sup> January 2021 and continues in force until 28<sup>th</sup> January 2022 inclusive) being extended and continuing in force until 28<sup>th</sup> January 2023 or until completion of the relevant works, whichever is the sooner.

The Order has the following effect:-

No person shall: -

- (a) cause any pedal cycle to proceed,
- (b) cause any horse to proceed,
- (c) cause any animal to proceed

in the following length of Bridleway at Beeston in the Borough of Broxtowe:-

<u>Beeston Bridleway No.73</u>, at the bridge over Works Pond, Attenborough Nature Reserve, at grid reference SK 5247 3481.

**AND NOTICE IS HEREBY FURTHER GIVEN** that during the period of restriction there is no alternative route available for bridleway users on public rights of way.

## The bridge is open for use by those on foot only

If the works are not completed within the above period, the Order may be extended for a longer period with the further approval of the Secretary of State for Transport.

The prohibition is required to protect public safety due to the weak bridge at Works Pond.
