[CHAIR'S REPORT](#)

The report highlighted a number of items for the Board's information, including plans for flu campaign, joint working on autism and updates on Substance Misuse in Nottinghamshire. The Chair highlighted that Bassetlaw would move from being part of the South Yorkshire and Bassetlaw Integrated Care System to being within the Nottingham and Nottinghamshire Integrated Care System in April 2022, as part of the proposals of the Health and Care Bill.

The Chair also observed that Nottinghamshire is doing remarkably well with COVID vaccination uptake and that 1.2 million vaccinations have been delivered across Nottingham and Nottinghamshire. Jonathan Gribbin confirmed that convenience was an important factor in driving vaccine take-up, and NHS colleagues have been helping to ensure that people can walk in without appointments. The Chairman raised the issue of substance misuse interventions, with liver disease one of the biggest killers of middle-aged men and deaths from drug abuse are at an all-time high.

[POLICE AND CRIME PLAN FOR NOTTINGHAMSHIRE 2021 - 2025](#)

The Chairman welcomed Caroline Henry, the Police and Crime Commissioner for Nottingham and Nottinghamshire, who was elected in May 2021. Under the Police Reform and Social Responsibility Act 2011 Police and Crime Commissioners must produce a Police and Crime Plan which sets out the Commissioner's strategic police and crime objective for their area. In doing so, the Commissioner also has a statutory requirement to obtain the views of local residents and stakeholders on the objectives of the plan.

The Commissioner presented the current proposals and areas of shared concern and priority for the Commissioner and the Health and Wellbeing Board. Caroline Henry emphasised the importance of partnership working and explained that a series of engagement events were already taking place

– these included thematic events, such as, violence against women and girls with a focus on preventative work, responding and supporting.

NOTTINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL'S COUNCIL PLAN 2021 – 2025

Derek Higton, Service Director – Transformation and Change – Nottinghamshire County Council, presented the report, the purpose of which was to provide a presentation on proposals for Nottinghamshire County Council's developing Council Plan, and its vision and priorities for Nottinghamshire.

Through the Council Plan, Nottinghamshire County Council will set out a long-term strategic vision for Nottinghamshire, and identify priority actions over the next four years that will support communities in Nottinghamshire towards greater resilience and recovery from the impacts of COVID-19. The Plan will show how the Local Authority and its partners will work together to secure the best for its residents and communities and deliver high-quality, sustainable services that are responsive, efficient and forward-looking. It would also seek to understand the socio-economic impact of COVID-19.

JOINT HEALTH AND WELLBEING STRATEGY 2022 – 2026

Sue Foley, Public Health Consultant – Nottinghamshire County Council, introduced the report, the purpose of which was to outline the approach to refreshing the Nottinghamshire Joint Health and Wellbeing Strategy for 2022 – 2026. The Chair stated that the development of the strategy represented a monumental challenge and reminded the Board that healthy life expectancy was declining even before the pandemic. Jonathan Gribbin commented that this was not merely an opportunity to get back to where we were but to do something above and beyond. As well as working with partners, monitoring and evaluation would be key; something proportionate and reasonable that holds us all to account is what is required. The report outlined the next steps planned for refreshing the strategy including a series of engagement events.

JOINT COMMISSIONING FOR INTERGRATED CARE AND BETTER CARE FUND UPDATE

Kashif Ahmed, Service Director - Strategic Commissioning & Integration - Nottinghamshire County Council, introduced the report, the purpose of which was to update the Board on the approach to Joint Commissioning for Integrated Care in the Nottingham and Nottinghamshire Integrated Care System.

MENTAL HEALTH PROMOTION

Cath Pritchard, Public Health Consultant, introduced the report, the purpose of which was to seek to confirm actions for the Board to take on mental health promotion to improve and maintain mental wellbeing, reduce the incidence of poor mental health across all ages in Nottinghamshire, and ensure all people are supported to achieve good mental health throughout their lives.
