

Additional Information re: User Evidence Statement in connection with: Grange Avenue to Marsh Lane Footpath

I've amended the map I originally submitted with my Statement and added more detail about my use of the path.

When looking at the map I sent with my form I noticed it didn't show the path continuing along "Gypsy Lane" to Marsh Lane. I'd assumed Gypsy Lane was just a lane so I didn't need to mark the path going along it. I've now discovered that this lane is owned by a Mr Benson, so I've amended this on the attached map. I've also attached a map I've recently hand drawn

The fence I've shown on my hand drawn map was put up by the Council, this was to stop gypsies from camping on the field. The Council left a gap so we could continue to use the path.

Me and my family used to use the path ever since we'd moved on to the Grange Estate back in 1976. Everybody used to use it as a shortcut to get to the Doctors, to the little shop that used to be there by the railway bridge or to the pub, the Packet Inn which has gone now too.

We used to have to cross a drainage ditch and when the wooden bridge that crossed it rotted, the drainage board put in a new concrete one with steel hand rails. There were also 2 stiles we used, to get into the last field we had to cross and another one to take us onto Gypsy Lane – I don't know who put these up.

I used to use the path every weekend as I was away working in the week but my wife and children used to use it all the time. I've always been a countryman and at weekends I'd take my dogs - I've had too many over the years to list them, and cross over to Marsh Lane and then maybe go up Soss Lane to get on to the Idle Bank or from Albion Terrace to cut across the fields to West Stockwith.

Problems started with us being able to use the path when a tenant took over one of the fields. He was alright to start with but then didn't want people using the path, he was threatening and then took out the bridge over the ditch so it was very difficult to cross. It was then I decided to make this application.
