

**THE NOTTINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL  
(A614/A6097 JUNCTIONS IMPROVEMENT SCHEME)  
(SIDE ROADS) ORDER 2022**

**HIGHWAYS ACT 1980**

The Nottinghamshire County Council ("the Council") hereby give notice that it **has made** and submitted to the Secretary of State for Transport for confirmation, an Order under section 14 and section 125 of the Highways Act 1980 authorising the Council to: -

- (a) Improve highways (including raising, lowering or otherwise altering);
- (b) Stop up highways;
- (c) Construct new highways;
- (d) Stop up private means of access to premises; and
- (e) Provide new means of access to said premises

along the A614 / A6097 corridor, at the following six existing junctions within the Newark and Sherwood District and Borough of Rushcliffe in the County of Nottinghamshire:-

- (a) A614 / A616 / A6075 roundabout – referred to as Ollerton Roundabout;
- (b) A614 / Mickledale Lane crossroads – referred to as Mickledale Lane Junction;
- (c) A614 / Mansfield Road roundabout – referred to as White Post Roundabout;
- (d) A614 / A6097 priority junction – referred to as Warren Hill Junction;
- (e) A6097 / A612 Nottingham Road / Southwell Road roundabout – referred to as Lowdham Roundabout; and
- (f) A6097 / Kirk Hill signalised crossroads – referred to as Kirk Hill Junction.

Any person may not later than 18<sup>th</sup> November 2022 object to the confirmation of the Order by notice to the Secretary of State for Transport, National Transport Casework Team, Tyneside House, Skinnerburn Road, Newcastle Business Park, Newcastle Upon Tyne, NE4 7AR stating the title of the Order and the grounds of objection.

In submitting an objection, it should be noted that your personal data and correspondence will be passed to the Council to enable your objection to be considered. If you do not wish your personal data to be forwarded, please state your reasons when submitting your objection and the Secretary of State will copy your representations, with your name and address removed, to the Council.
