

TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF FOOTPATH

THE NOTTINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (BUNNY FOOTPATH NO.17) (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION) CONTINUATION ORDER 2025

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Nottinghamshire County Council HAS MADE an ORDER, under Sections 14 and 15(8) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be:

To continue the effects of THE NOTTINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (BUNNY FOOTPATH NO.17 (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION) NOTICE 2025.

That Notice came into force on 25th November 2025.

The effects are that:-

No person shall:-

(a) proceed on foot,

in the following length of footpath at Bunny in the Borough of Rushcliffe.

Bunny Footpath No.17 from its junction with Bunny Bridleway No.4 at SK 57353 30715 to where Bunny Footpath joins the farm track at SK 56979 30632.

AND NOTICE IS HEREBY FURTHER GIVEN that during the period of restriction the alternative route available for pedestrians will be as follows:-

Bunny Bridleway No.4, Bunny Footpath No.2, Bunny Bridleway No.5, Bunny Footpath No.18, Bunny Footpath No.8, Bunny Footpath No.7 and vice versa.

IT IS INTENDED that the prohibition respecting the above highway or highways will apply as follows:-

To 25th May 2026 inclusive.

The Continuation Order will come into force on 16th December 2025 and any prohibition contained in the continued Order shall apply on that day and on any subsequent day or days when it shall be necessary for the prohibition to apply to enable works to be carried out and the Order shall continue in full force until the works it is proposed to carry out are completed. The duration of this Order may be extended with the approval of the relevant Secretary of State.

The prohibition is required to protect public safety until essential repairs can be completed to timber footbridges along this route.
