#### **Child Poverty Summer 2025 Information for Professionals**

# Government information on Child Poverty and the Child Poverty Task Force:

In Summer 2024 the government announced the formation of the Child Poverty Task Force, with plans to publish a new strategy set for later in 2025.

### A government spokesperson said:

"We've already expanded free breakfast clubs, introduced a cap on the cost of school uniforms, increased the national minimum wage for those on the lowest incomes, uprated benefits in April and supported 700,000 of the poorest families by introducing a Fair Repayment Rate on Universal Credit deductions.

"We will publish an ambitious child poverty strategy later this year to ensure we deliver fully-funded measures that tackle the structural and root causes of child poverty across the country."

# <u>Information for schools:</u>

In a class of 30 children, it is estimated that almost 10 of them will be living in a family experiencing poverty and according to research carried out by CPAG

- 79 per cent of school staff say they and their colleagues increasingly have less time and capacity for other parts of their roles because of the effects of child poverty.
- 74 per cent of school staff say there is evidence that children in poverty are falling further behind than previously at school.
