



Help with childcare costs: Disability Access Fund



This easy read document tells you about additional support with childcare costs for children with disabilities.

What is the Disabled Access Fund?



Organisations that provide childcare places for children might be able to receive money from the Disability Access Fund to help with costs of supporting children with disabilities.



For each child in receipt of Disability Living Allowance (DLA) the provider accepts, they can receive £915 each year.

Who is eligible?



The Disability Access Fund payment can be made if:



the child has been awarded Disability
 Living Allowance (DLA)



the child attends funded nursery
 entitlement at a day nursery, pre-school,
 childminder or school nursery, and



• the child is aged 2, 3 or 4.

What is Disability Living Allowance (DLA)?



Disability Living Allowance (DLA) for children is a government benefit to help with the extra costs of looking after a child, under the age of 16, who has disabilities.



The disabilities that qualify a child for DLA include difficulties walking or needs that require much more looking after than a child of the same age who does not have a disability



There are other eligibility requirements.

How is the Disability Access Fund paid?



The Disability Access Fund payment is made directly to the childcare provider to help them with their extra costs.



Eligible "early years providers" include day nurseries, pre-schools, registered childminders and school nurseries and other organisations offering Foundation Stage 1 support, that offer funded entitlement places.



Primary schools cannot claim DAF funding for 4-year-olds; but maintained nurseries can.



If a parent is splitting their funded childcare entitlement across two or more providers, they will need to choose which one receives the Disabled Access Fund grant.



This will usually be the one where the child attends for most of their funded hours.


