



# The council's role as "lead local flood authority"




This easy read document tells you about the Nottinghamshire County Council's role as **lead local flood authority**.

## The role of the Council



Being **lead local flood authority** means that Nottinghamshire County Council is responsible for taking the lead on flood management and risk in Nottinghamshire.



We work with partners to manage flooding from surface water, ordinary watercourses, and groundwater.

## Preliminary flood risk assessment



We last updated our preliminary flood risk assessment (PFRA) in 2023.



A PFRA looks at floods that have happened in the past and floods that could happen in the future.



When we update the PFRA we think about flooding from surface water runoff, groundwater and ordinary watercourses.

# Local flood risk management strategy



By law, we must publish a local flood risk management strategy and an action plan.

## "Section 19" reports



By law, we must write reports on flooding that has happened in Nottinghamshire.

These are known as "section 19 reports".




A **section 19 report** tells you what happened and whether we have done what we are supposed to. Section 19 reports do say what should be done to stop future floods.



Our <u>section 19 reports are published on our website</u>. These are not available in easy read format.

# Section 21 asset register







The register has information about who owns them and their state of repair.



We have worked with Nottingham City
Council to produce a joint register. You can
search the combined section 21 asset
register on a special website.

# Flood map for planning



The Government has produced an <u>online</u> searchable map you can use to see if somewhere is at risk of flooding.

#### **Education**



Our flood risk management team has an "augmented reality Sandbox" which can be used by schools to show how landscapes effect flooding and the impacts of flooding.


