a café



• a farm shop



• a garden centre



• a children's play area



• Employment training



You can buy fresh fruit and vegetables at the farm shop.



You can also buy bedding plants and flowers.



You can't pick your own fruit at the farm.



In the future you will be able to pick flowers.



Brooke Farm offers offer employment training for adults with disabilities.

This is a way for you to learn skills that might help you find work.



Employment training can help you become more confident at work.

10:00 am to 3:30 pm






The café has a garden where you can relax and enjoy the fresh air.

• Eggs


Free range eggs from a farm in Lincolnshire. It also sells duck eggs




• Fruit and vegetables


Fruit and vegetables grown at the farm are sold in the farm shop.

sauces


spices

• fresh cut flowers grown on the farm




hanging baskets

The play area is open:






Monday to Saturday:10:00 am to 4:30 pm

# **Employment training**



Brooke Farm offers an employment training course.



The course teaches skills that are useful at work and that could help you find a job and earn money.



The farm teaches up to 40 people at a time.



The course is **person focused**. This means we want to understand what makes you special and how we can support you.



The course is **strength-based**. This means we want to know what things you're good at and help you use them.

The type of jobs you can learn about at Brooke Farm include:







- growing plants
- working in a shop
- serving customers in the café

Brooke Farm also teaches you skills to help you to find a job, including:







• how to write a CV



• how to do well at interviews



You will need to do at least three days a week on the course.



The course can last from 12 weeks up to three years.



The length will be decided based on what would be most helpful for you.



We will keep checking what is going well and what could be changed to make it better for you.
