

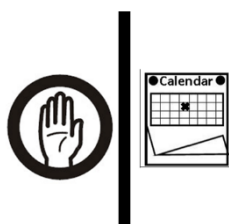
# Exclusions from Education

This document tells you about the 2 types of exclusions from education.



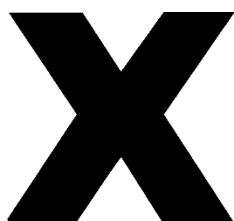
The 2 types of exclusions are:

- Permanent exclusion.
- Fixed term exclusion (sometimes called a suspension.)

## Permanent exclusion



A permanent exclusion is where you are told you cannot go back to the school, college or post-16 learning placement.



You can be permanently excluded only if:



- There has been a **serious breach** or incident.

A serious breach means you have broken a very important rule.



- There have been several breaches of the setting's behaviour policy.

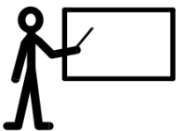
This means you keep doing things that are against the rules.



- If you were allowed to stay, it would seriously harm the education or welfare of:



-You.



-Staff members.

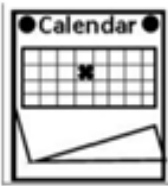


-Other students or people at the setting.

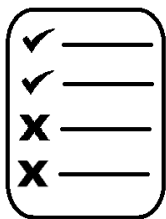
## Fixed term exclusion (sometimes called a suspension)



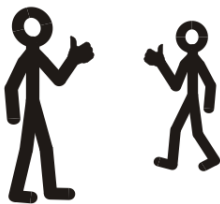
A suspension, or fixed term exclusion, is where a pupil is temporarily removed from the setting.



This means you are not allowed to go for a set amount of time, but after that you are allowed to go back.



This happens to help manage behaviour and it should be explained in your setting's behaviour policy.



On your return, support will be put in place to help you succeed and not get suspended again.

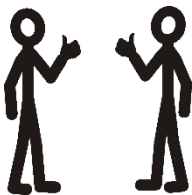
