

TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF FOOTPATH

THE NOTTINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
(HAWTON FOOTPATH NO.5)
(TEMPORARY PROHIBITION) CONTINUATION NO.4 ORDER 2026

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Secretary of State Transport in pursuance of the powers conferred by Sections 14 and 15 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 approves of The Nottinghamshire County Council (Hawton Footpath No.5) (Temporary Prohibition) Notice 2024(which came into force on 17th October 2024 and was continued in force by a Continuation Order which remained in force until 16th April 2025 and was then continued in force by a Continuation No.2 Order which remained in force until 16th October 2025 and was then continued in force by a Continuation No.3 Order which remains in force until 16th April 2026 inclusive) being extended and continuing in force until 16th October 2026 or until completion of the relevant works, whichever is the sooner.

The Order has the following effect:-

No person shall: -

- (a) proceed on foot,

in the following length of Footpath at Hawton in the District of Newark and Sherwood: -

Hawton Footpath No.5, between its junction with the road at Hawton Village and the edge of the woodland at SK 7901 5034, a distance of 630 metres

AND NOTICE IS HEREBY FURTHER GIVEN that during the period of restriction there is no alternative route available for pedestrians on public rights of way.

If the works are not completed within the above period the Order may be extended for a longer period with the further approval of the Secretary of State for Transport.

The prohibition is required to protect public safety and enable major civil engineering works associated with the Middlebeck development.
