

# **Privacy Notice for:**

- Enforcement of Civil Parking, Bus Lanes and other Moving Traffic Contraventions
- Parking Permit Management.

#### Introduction

This privacy notice explains how the Council uses your data to undertake the Enforcement of Civil Parking, Bus Lanes, No Stopping at Bus Stops, Keep Clear Zones near Schools and Moving Traffic Contraventions at junctions and to manage permits issued for residents, visitors and Special Access.

# Who will be using your data?

Nottinghamshire County Council will be the data controller for the data you provide to us.

We may also contract third party organisations to process your data on our behalf (e.g. suppliers of business systems such as our Business Management System).

#### What personal data do we use?

- Name, address and contact Details
- Age
- Date of birth
- Gender
- Images captured by CCTV ANPR cameras (including motorists, pedestrians, bus passengers, other road/footpath users).
- Business activities
- Licences and permits held
- Vehicle registration details
- Vehicle location details including images
- Call recording

# What types of special category personal data do we need from you?

- Medical details provided as part of any appeal against a Penalty Charge Notice or as part of an application for a Special Access Permit.
- Financial data provided as part of any appeal against a Penalty Charge Notice

We also process data about criminal convictions, criminal offences or related security measures provided as part of any appeal against a Penalty Charge Notice.

### Why do we use your data?

- To undertake Civil Parking Enforcement
- To undertake Enforcement of Bus Lanes and No Stopping in Bus Stops
- To undertake Enforcement of Keep Clear Zones near Schools
- To undertake Enforcement of Moving Traffic Contraventions at Boxed Junctions and Restricted Access Junctions
- To issue Residents, Visitors or Special Access permits in accordance with the Council's policies.

# What legal reasons allow us to use your data in this way?

Our legal basis for processing your personal data is that it is necessary to perform our public tasks as a local authority, and to fulfil our legal obligations.

Our legal basis for processing your special category personal data is that it is necessary for the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims.

Our legal basis for processing data about criminal convictions, criminal offences or related security measures is that it is necessary to perform our public tasks as a local authority, and to fulfil our legal obligations.

# Who may we share your data with or receive it from?

- Enforcement Agents (Bailiffs)
- The Traffic Enforcement Centre, Northampton County Court
- The European Collection Agency (for vehicles registered outside of the UK)
- The Traffic Penalty Tribunal
- Local Authorities within Nottinghamshire within the Notts Parking Partnership
- Credit reference agencies
- The Police

The Council's <u>Appropriate Policy Document (APD) | Nottinghamshire County Council</u> describes how we will protect special category and criminal convictions data.

#### May personal data be transferred overseas?

The Council may for operational purposes transfer personal data overseas. In these cases, we will ensure that your personal data is protected and there are safeguards

for the protection of your rights. Please refer to the <u>County Council's privacy</u> <u>statement</u> for further details.

# How long is your data kept for?

This information is held in accordance with the Council's retention schedule – see here.

### What will happen if you do not provide or we cannot obtain the data needed?

- We could not undertake Enforcement of Civil Parking, Moving Traffic Contraventions, No Stopping in Bus Stops or Keep Clear Zones near Schools in accordance with our statutory duties.
- We could not manage permit administration in accordance with the Councils policies.

# Does the service make decisions using fully automated processes?

### What rights do you have over this use of your data?

- To be informed about how we use your data
- To access a copy of your data that we process
- To have us rectify or correct your data that we process
- To restrict our processing of your personal data
- To object to the use of your data
- To have your personal data erased
- To request that we transfer your information to you or another organisation
- To object to fully automated decision making
- To withdraw your consent (if it the legal reason why we use your data).

Some of these rights are subject to exceptions. Please refer to the <u>County Council's privacy statement</u> part 10 for further details.
