



Help with childcare costs: for parents who are students



This easy read document tells you about childcare support you can get if you are studying.

Care to Learn



<u>Care to Learn</u> pays for childcare costs whilst you study if you are under 20 years old at the start of your course.



You need to apply before the start of your course or as soon as possible after your course has started.



You can get up to £180 per week to help with the cost of childcare and taking your child to their childcare.



Childcare payments go straight to the childcare provider.



Travel payments go straight to your school or college.



You can apply for Care to Learn at the <u>Student Bursary Support Service</u>.

Childcare Grant



You can get 85 per cent of your childcare costs, or a fixed maximum amount, whatever is less.



The maximum you can get is:

Up to £199.62 a week for 1 child

Up to £342.24 a week for 2 or more children



You have to pay any remaining costs for childcare.



Parents in full time education with children under 15, or under 17 if they have special educational needs or disabilities can have the childcare grant if they are eligible for student finance.

Learner Support



If you are 19 or over, on a further education course and living with money difficulties you may be eligible for Learner Support.



Your learning provider, such as a college, decides how much money you get.



This can help to pay for things like accommodation and travel, course materials and equipment, and childcare.
