This easy read document tells you about outdoor activities in Nottinghamshire.



There are several green spaces in the county that you can explore and enjoy by walking, cycling and horse riding, including:



- Country Parks
- Nature Reserves
- Open Access Land

Walking with dogs



You are allowed to take your dog on any [right of way](#) route.



However, they must be on a lead or under close control.



It is illegal to let a dog run loose in a field with sheep. A farmer can shoot a dog if it is attacking livestock




You must clean up after your dog otherwise you can get a fine

Rights of way (public paths)



You can walk on all public rights of way. They should be clear from obstruction.



Fences, gates and stiles must be in good condition, easy to open and unlocked.

There are four types of rights of way:



- **Footpaths** are marked with yellow arrows. They can be used by walkers, including people using mobility scooters or powered wheelchairs.



- **Bridleways** are marked with blue arrows. They can be used by walkers, horse riders and cyclists.



- **Restricted Byways** are marked with burgundy arrows. They can be used by walkers, horse riders, cyclists and horse and cart users.



- **Byways** are marked with red arrows. They can be used by walkers, horse riders, cyclists, car users, motorcyclists and horse and cart users.

Cycling



Nottinghamshire has over 650 miles of urban and countryside cycle routes.



When cycling always be considerate to other people using the right of way.



Take care of the land you are using the needs of the people who own or occupy the land. Follow the [Countryside Code](#).

Three routes on the [National Cycle Network](#) run through Nottinghamshire:



- [Route 6](#) (London to the Lake District) with a section from Nottingham to Worksop / Derby.

- [Route 64](#) (Melton Mowbray to Lincoln) includes a section from Bingham to Lincoln, through Newark.

- [Route 15](#) (connecting Route 6 in Leicestershire to Route 1 in Lincolnshire) includes a section from Nottingham to Bingham.


