

TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF MULTIUSER PATH

THE NOTTINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (CARLTON MULTIUSER PATH) (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION) CONTINUATION ORDER 2025

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Nottinghamshire County Council HAS MADE an ORDER, under Sections 14 and 15(8) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be:

To continue the effects of THE NOTTINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (**CARLTON MULTIUSER PATH**) (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION) NOTICE **2025**.

That Notice came into force on 6th October 2025.

The effects are that:-

No person shall: -

- (a) proceed on foot,
- (b) cause any pedal cycle to proceed,
- (c) cause any horse to proceed,
- (d) cause any animal to proceed

in the following length of multiuser path at Carlton in the Borough of Gedling:

Carlton Multiuser Path between Douglas Avenue and Midland Road, Carlton.

AND NOTICE IS HEREBY FURTHER GIVEN that during the period of restriction there is no alternative route available.

<u>IT IS INTENDED</u> that the prohibition respecting the above highway or highways will apply as follows:-

To 31st January 2026 inclusive.

This closure will only be in place overnight between the hours of 8pm and 6am, Monday to Friday and the path will reopen at all other times.

The Continuation Order will come into force on 27th October 2025 and any prohibition contained in the continued Order shall apply on that day and on any subsequent day or days when it shall be necessary for the prohibition to apply to enable works to be carried out and the Order shall continue in full force until the works it is proposed to carry out are completed The duration of this Order may be extended with the approval of the relevant Secretary of State.

The prohibition is required to protect public safety, and enable clearance of trees alongside the railway track, for safe running of trains.
