

NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

THE NOTTINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (LINDHURST BRIDLEWAY NO. 2) DIVERSION ORDER 2026

The above Order, made on Wednesday 11th February 2026 under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980, will divert the whole width of that part of the public right of way commencing from a point SK 5673 5692 (marked A on the order plan), and proceeding in a south-easterly and then north easterly direction for a distance of approximately 114 metres to a point SK 5683 5693 (marked B on the order plan), as shown on the displayed map to a route commencing from a point SK 5673 5692 at the junction with the south-western remainder of Lindhurst Bridleway No.2, (marked A on the order plan), and proceeding for a distance of approximately 112 metres in a north-easterly then east-south-easterly direction on a grass and earth surface to a point, SK 5683 5693, (marked B on the order plan), the junction with the north-eastern remainder of Lindhurst Bridleway No.2, and with a width of 4 metres.

Any representations about or objections to the Order must be received by the Countryside Access Team in writing at the address given below or by e-mail to Countryside.Access@nottscc.gov.uk not later than Wednesday 18th March 2026. Please state the grounds on which they are made and include your name and address.

If no such representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Nottinghamshire County Council may themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation any representations and objections which have not been withdrawn will be sent with it.
