## Introduction





Local councils provide public services in a particular area.

They help the people who live in their area by providing services.











There are 3 types of local government in England:

- Two-tier
- Unitary authority
- Combined authority

**Two-tier** means there is one large county council and a group of smaller councils.

The smaller councils are called **district and borough councils**.

The county council does some things for the whole county.

The district and borough councils do other things for their local area.









Everywhere in Nottinghamshire is a **twotier** area, except for Nottingham City.

**Unitary authority** means there is one council that does everything. Nottingham City Council is a unitary authority.

**Combined authority** means there is more than one council working together to help a bigger area.


Nottinghamshire County Council is part of a **combined authority** called the East Midlands Combined County Authority.


## **Nottinghamshire County Council**



Nottinghamshire County Council does things for the whole of Nottinghamshire but not the City of Nottingham.













Nottinghamshire County Council is run by 66 county councillors.

Each councillor represents a particular area of the county, known as wards, or electoral divisions.

There are 56 wards in Nottinghamshire, and each one will have one or two councillors, depending on its size.

**County Councillors** 

- use their knowledge and views to help make Council decisions
- represent the interests of the residents in their area
- check the quality of services provided by the County Council









help local people use County Council services and find information.

They do this by:

- attending full council meetings
- sitting on committees or the Cabinet
- working closely with other agencies that operate in their area
- holding regular surgeries for the public to raise issues or find out information.

The Council operates an Executive Leader and Cabinet model which means that big decisions are taken by the Cabinet and Cabinet Members.

The leader of Nottinghamshire County Council is Councillor Mick Barton.







You can find out who your local councillor is by <u>using our online form</u>.

You will need to know your postcode and house name or number.


The form will tell who your councillor is and also the name of the ward you live in.

- Libraries
- Transport and roads
- Waste recycling
- Social care for children and adults
- Fostering
- Helping people stay healthy
- Preventing floods
- Keeping people safe from fires and other dangers



- Keeping people in the area safe
- Collecting rubbish
- Planning applications. This is how people get permission to build something in the area.
- Leisure







- Collecting council tax. This is money that people pay towards local services.
- Organising elections so that people can vote for their councillors, MPs and other elected officials.

## Parish and town councils











Parish and town councils are even smaller than the borough and district councils.

These councils do things for villages and other small communities.

Parish and town councils are responsible for things like:

- Community centres and village halls
- Allotments, which are places you can grow your own vegetables
- Play areas and parks

## **East Midlands Combined County Authority**













<u>The East Midlands Combined County</u> <u>Authority</u> (EMCCA) is a combined authority.

Nottinghamshire County Council is part of the EMCCA.

The other councils are:

- Nottingham City Council
- Derby City Council
- Derbyshire County Council

The person in charge of the EMCCA is called the Executive Mayor. The Executive Mayor of the East Midlands is <u>Claire Ward</u>.

The EMCCA wants to make the East Midlands the best place to live, to work, and to learn.

They will do this by working with people and groups in local areas.

They are responsible for things including

- Transport
- Housing
- Skills and Adult Education

- Economic Growth


## **Nottinghamshire Police and Crime Commissioner**



The <u>Police and Crime Commissioner</u> sets the priorities for the local police force.








The Police and Crime Commissioner also:

## Elections




If you don't know your constituency area, you can find out who your local MP is by using your postcode in <u>this online form</u>.

Elections are your chance to decide who makes the decisions that affect you and where you live.

The next elections are due to take place on the following dates:

- Borough and district councils Thursday 6 May 2027
- Mayor of the East Midlands
  Thursday 4 May 2028
- Police and Crime Commissioner Thursday 4 May 2028













Nottinghamshire County Council
 Thursday 3 May 2029

The last county council elections took place on 1 May 2025. The election in Mansfield North was delayed and will be held on Thursday 12 June 2025.

We have a separate <u>easy read document</u> <u>about the county council elections</u> in Mansfield North on 12 June 2025.

Members of Parliament MPs are elected in a General Election.

The Prime Minister chooses when to call a general election and must call the next one by Thursday 9 August 2029.

The government wants to change council structures. If this happens, election dates for county, district and borough councils will change.









**By-elections** take place if a councillor, MP, Executive Mayor or Police and Crime Commissioner leaves or is not allowed to have this job for some reason.

Your district or borough council will let you know if a by-election is being held in your ward or constituency.

My Vote My Voice is an advocacy group set up by United Response, Dimensions, Mencap and Ambitious About Autism.

They have produced <u>a set of easy read</u> <u>documents</u> to make sure that everyone has the information and support they need to take part in the local elections.
