

In the 1700s, the **Industrial Revolution** saw lots of new technology, including canals and railways to transport goods.



In Nottinghamshire, the Industrial Revolution led to the growth of **lace and cotton** industries.



In the 1800s and 1900s, **coal mining** was a big industry. Lots of people had jobs as coal miners across the county.
